DON'T WORRY ... TRUST GOD!

If I ever visited you at home or in the hospital and you were going through some difficult times, or maybe preparing for a surgery, I have probably shared with you the words from Psalm 37. It has become a favorite scripture passage of mine that gives hope and encouragement.

David begins in verse 1 with the words, “*Do not fret.*” Now I like to look at that phrase as a reminder that we are not to “fret” or “worry” about evil things that come our way. These evil things could be sins, health problems, relationship issues, financial struggles, addictions, and much more. Why shouldn't we fret or worry? Because those things will soon pass away just as grass and green plants soon wither away.

Then in verse 3, David instructs us to “*trust in the Lord and enjoy His safe pasture.*” When we find ourselves fretting over things that weigh us down, it is hard to trust God. But David says not only to trust God, but to take “*delight in the Lord*” (verse 4) and he will give you the desires of your heart. What are our desires? Well, most of the time we desire to get through those life's struggles that we find ourselves worrying about!!!

So in review, we are not to *fret or worry*, we are to *trust in the Lord, take delight* in all the things that we know God can do for us, and then verse 6, it tells us to “*commit your way to the Lord*”. Commit to God whatever it is you are dealing with, and then let him deal with it!

I don't know about you, but I find all too often, I want to fix things myself. I get to believing I can win the battle by relying on my own strength! WRONG!!! The only way I/we can win the battle is to rely on God's strength to lead us to victory.

Now, I know it is hard to always trust God to bring us through our struggles, but David then makes it even harder. Verse 7 says, “*Be still before the LORD, and wait patiently for him*”.

WOW! As if it's not hard enough to just trust God, now he wants us to be still and wait, and not just wait, but *wait patiently!*

David then concludes these first seven verses by again reminding us to “*do not fret*”.

What are you struggling with today? Whatever it is, follow the advice Psalm 37 brings to you:

- Do not fret (worry)
- Trust in the Lord
- Take delight in the Lord,
- Commit your struggles over to him
- Be still and wait patiently for him
- And do not fret (worry)

Praying for you as you trust God and in the stillness of the day, wait patiently upon him!

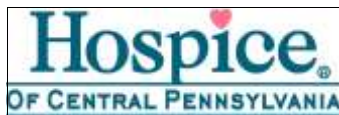
